

FALL 2009 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

SIGNIFICANT DATES

- **May 28, 2009:** Acceptance of Ryerson's Offer of Admission online via the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) must be received by May 28, 2009 or earlier (or by the confirmation deadline date indicated in the student's official Offer of Admission letter) in order to confirm acceptance of a scholarship.
- **July 7, 2009:** Tuition deposit of \$1,000 must be received at Ryerson by this date to avoid cancellation of both the Offer of Admission and scholarship.
- **July 31, 2009:** Final grades must be received by Ryerson University via the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) by July 31, 2009. Final grades and/or grade amendments received after July 31 cannot be considered for scholarship purposes.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

- Scholarship consideration is based on courses taken during the 2008-09 regular school year (fall and winter terms) with a maximum of two repeat grades. Students must: a) be currently enrolled full time (minimum of three Ontario Grade 12 U/M courses or equivalent within the 2008-09 regular school year); b) have been continuously enrolled full-time (i.e. no gaps in full-time attendance prior to the 2008-2009 regular school year); c) enrolling in a post-secondary institution for the first time.
- Entrance scholarship averages are calculated using an applicant's best six Ontario Grade 12 U/M courses (mid-term and/or final) or equivalent. Scholarship averages are based on two decimal points and are not rounded.
- Grade 12 U/M courses with credit values of less than 1.00, and the "out of school" component of Grade 12 U/M co-op courses or equivalent, are not eligible for scholarship consideration.
- Entrance scholarships are not transferable between programs and are only valid for the academic year in which they are offered (i.e. may not be deferred).
- Entrance scholarships cannot be combined. Students who qualify for and/or receive more than one scholarship/award will receive financial credit in their Ryerson student account for the scholarship/award of the total highest value to a maximum of \$10,000.
- Scholarship amounts are credited to the recipient's Ryerson student account and paid out in two installments: 50% at the start of fall term; 50% at start of winter term (with continued full-time enrollment at Ryerson).
- The availability and monetary value of all awards, bursaries and scholarships are subject to change. The Student Financial Assistance Office reserves the right to change the listed award, scholarship or bursary information and/or value without notice.
- Awards Subject to Cancellation: Applicable to all scholarships and all years, students that withdraw, reduce their course load, alter their program of study, experience a decline in grades or no longer meet other scholarship eligibility/requirements may have to forfeit all or part of their award. The decision will be made by the Student Financial Assistance Office and will be based on the terms of the award, circumstances leading to the student becoming ineligible and educational costs incurred already. A cancelled award will be a charge against the student's University customer/fee account.
- Every attempt has been made to be clear in the communication of the Terms and Conditions outlined in this document. In the event of any interpretive disputes, Ryerson University reserves the right to render a final determination on eligibility for scholarship and renewability.

Additional Terms and Conditions Applicable to all Renewable Scholarships/Awards

- Students must maintain an 80% course load in both the fall and winter terms with a minimum CGPA of 3.67.
- Fall and winter semester courses are used to calculate CGPAs. Spring and summer semester courses are not included in CGPA calculations.
- The scholarship is eligible for renewability for four calendar years from the term of admission only. If you are in a co-op program, which extends your studies to five years, you will not receive the scholarship for a fifth year. If you are participating in a 12 to 16 month internship during the academic year, your scholarship will be deferred to the following academic year and will be issued upon your return to full-time classes.
- Renewable values are based on the original scholarship value only and will be issued for each year the student is qualified (e.g. If the student does not qualify for renewal going into second year, he/she can re-gain the award in subsequent years subject to meeting the stated minimum CPGA and course load requirements).
- The Student Financial Assistance Office will automatically review the student's academic record at the end of years 1, 2 and 3, and confirm by July 31st of each year whether the scholarship will be renewed.

FALL 2009 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Who's Eligible for Guaranteed and Competitive Scholarships? Current full-time (Fall 08/09) Ontario Grade 12 U/M Secondary School Applicants who are Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents who will start full-time, four-year undergraduate degree programs at Ryerson in Fall 2009, and who are enrolling in a post-secondary institution for the first time.

- **A separate scholarship application is not required.** However, students must have an active application to a full-time undergraduate four-year degree program at Ryerson via the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) 101 application process, by May 1, 2009.
- If a student is not qualified for a Guaranteed Scholarship based on grades available mid-May, he/she will be automatically re-considered as final grades become available up to July 31, 2009 (grades must be reported to the OUAC by July 31, 2009). All course grades, including grade adjustments/corrections received after July 31 cannot be used for scholarship purposes.

FALL 2009 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General Scholarships | Application Required

Who's Eligible? Applicants who will start full-time, four-year undergraduate degree programs at Ryerson in Fall 2009 who are Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents and who are:

- a) Currently attending secondary school (in a province other than Ontario, or are attending an out-of-country Ontario secondary school) taking a minimum of three full-year courses (or equivalent) within the current academic year (Fall 08/09), and are enrolling in a post-secondary institution for the first time. **OR**
 - b) Currently not taking more than three full-year secondary school courses (or equivalent) within Ontario and have not taken more than one post-secondary course.
- 50 General Scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, are available to be awarded across all programs on a grades-competitive basis starting at 80% (final admission average).
 - A separate scholarship application is required and is available at www.ryerson.ca/awards. The deadline for consideration is April 1, 2009.

International Student Merit Scholarships | Application Not Required

Who's Eligible? International applicants entering year one of a full-time, four-year undergraduate degree program at Ryerson in Fall 2009, who are enrolling in a post-secondary institution for the first time, and who are:

- a) Currently enrolled in an Ontario Secondary School Grade 12U program with Study Permit authorization and have applied to Ryerson via the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)101 application process by May 1, 2009 will be considered on a competitive basis subject to the terms and conditions applicable to Ontario students (see Guaranteed and Competitive Scholarships above); **OR**
 - b) Currently enrolled in the final year of a secondary school outside of Ontario and will be entering Canada to study at Ryerson with Study Permit authorization and have first-class standing in their country's equivalent of the Ontario Grade 12U program.
- 35 International Merit Scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, are awarded across all programs on a grades-competitive basis starting at 80% or equivalent (final admission average).
 - Applicants are automatically considered for the awards. A separate scholarship application is not required.
 - International students who have attended a postsecondary institution (university or college) are not eligible for International Student Merit Entrance Achievement Scholarships.
 - International students must have a valid Canadian Study Permit by the time they register in courses at Ryerson and must remain an International student in their first year of study in order to receive and retain their scholarship.

President's National Entrance Scholarships | Renewable. Application Required

Who's Eligible? Current full-time (Fall 08/09) Secondary School Applicants in Canada who are Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents who will start full-time, four-year undergraduate degree programs at Ryerson in Fall 2009, and who are enrolling in a post-secondary institution for the first time with an academic average of 90% in six Ontario Grade 12 U/M courses (or equivalent).

- A separate application is required and available at www.ryerson.ca/awards. The deadline for consideration is April 1, 2009.
- Five President's National Entrance Scholarships are awarded annually (one per Faculty).
- Awards are valued at \$10,000 per year (total value of \$40,000) and are renewable each year with a 3.67 CGPA (see Renewable Scholarships).
- Recipients are guaranteed a place in residence for first year. Residence costs are the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.

FALL 2009 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Terence Grier Entrance Scholarship | Application Required

Who's Eligible? Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program at Ryerson in Fall 2009 who have a minimum average of 85% in six Ontario Grade 12 U/M courses or equivalent, an exceptional aptitude for (or interest in) the chosen field of study at Ryerson and no previous post-secondary studies.

- One Terence Grier Entrance Scholarship, value equal to tuition, is awarded annually.
 - A separate scholarship application is required and is available at www.ryerson.ca/awards. The deadline is April 1.

H. Graham Walker Award | Application Required

Who's Eligible? Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program at Ryerson in Fall 2009 who are Ontario residents and have a minimum average of 85% in six Ontario Grade 12 U/M courses, demonstrated financial need, and involvement in extracurricular activities in school or involvement in community or volunteer work.

- Each H. Graham Walker Award is valued at \$2,500; there are four 4 (2 male, 2 female) awarded annually.
 - A separate scholarship application is required and is available at www.ryerson.ca/awards. The deadline is August 1.

John Brooks Community Foundation Scholarships | Application Required

Who's Eligible? Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program at Ryerson in Fall 2009 who are Ontario residents and have a minimum average of 80% in six Grade 12 U/M courses, involvement in school, community, self-development program and other activities.

- Each John Brooks Community Foundation Scholarship is valued at \$1,500 each; there are 2 awarded annually.
 - Preference is given to students involved with the John Brooks Community Foundation.
 - A separate scholarship application is required. The deadline is in mid-July. Contact the John Brooks Community Foundation at 416-653-2627 or visit www.johnbrooksfoundation.org.

Pierre Lassonde Entrance Awards in Engineering | Application Required

Who's Eligible? Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program in Engineering at Ryerson in Fall 2009 who are Ontario residents and demonstrate financial need as determined Ryerson University through completion of a budget form and a minimum of 85% overall average in their final year of high school.

- Each Pierre Lassonde Entrance Award is valued at \$6,000; there are 6 awarded annually.
- A separate scholarship application, one to two page letter outlining academic accomplishments and leadership qualities and completion of an OTSS Student Budget form, is required.
- The deadline for consideration is May 15, 2009. Applications and details about eligibility, terms and conditions are available at www.ryerson.ca/awards.

FALL 2009 ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Ted Rogers School of Management Undergraduate Entrance Award Application Required

Who's Eligible? Current full-time (Fall 08/09) Secondary School Applicants in Canada who are Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program in Business Management, Hospitality and Tourism Management, Information Technology Management or Retail Management in the Ted Rogers School of Management who and demonstrate financial need as determined Ryerson University through completion of a budget form and a minimum of 85% average in their final year of high school.

- Each Ted Rogers School of Management Undergraduate Entrance Award is valued at \$10,000; there are four awarded annually.
- A separate scholarship application, two letters of support (from teacher, principal, employer, faculty member, and/or community leader), and a cover letter (outlining why you are an ideal candidate) are required.
- The deadline for consideration is April 30, 2009. Applications and details about eligibility are available at www.ryerson.ca/awards.

Ted Rogers School of Management Continuing Undergraduate Award | Renewable Application Required

Who's Eligible? Current full-time (Fall 08/09) Secondary School Applicants in Canada who are Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents entering year one of a four-year, full-time undergraduate degree program in Business Management, Hospitality and Tourism Management, Information Technology Management or Retail Management in the Ted Rogers School of Management who demonstrate financial need as determined Ryerson University through completion of a budget form and a minimum of 85% average in their final year of high school.

- Each Ted Rogers School of Management Continuing Undergraduate Entrance Award is valued at \$40,000 (the amount awarded in year one, and the annual renewable amount awarded if conditions are met, is \$10,000); there are four awarded annually.
- Applicants must be self-nominated or be nominated by faculty or a member of the community.
- A separate scholarship application and two letters of support (from teacher, principal, employers, faculty member or staff, and/or community leader) are required. The deadline for consideration is April 30, 2009. Applications and details about eligibility are available at www.ryerson.ca/awards.
