Self-Guided Tours

1. Jorgenson Hall / Podium / ServiceHub

Jorgenson Hall is largely dedicated to the Faculty of Arts and its 11 exciting programs.

The **Podium** is home to student services such as the Career Centre and International Student Support.

The newly built **ServiceHub** is your one-stop-shop for inquiries regarding admissions and fees.

2. Gould Street / Lake Devo / Bookstore

Gould Street is the centre of campus! It hosts our orientation, a weekly Farmers' Market and more.

Lake Devo is a recreational spot that seasonally alternates between a skating rink and a reflection pool.

The **Bookstore** is where you can find all of your textbooks, school supplies and Ryerson swag!

3. Kerr Hall / Recreation and Athletics Centre / Quad

Expansive **Kerr Hall** is home to numerous faculty offices, classrooms and the **Ryerson Theatre**.

The **Recreation and Athletics Centre** is one of two athletic facilities and offers a swimming pool and suspended track.

The **Quad** is a great patch of green space where many students study or enjoy outdoor activities.

4. Mattamy Athletic Centre

The **Mattamy Athletic Centre** houses a basketball court, hockey rink and several of our varsity teams, the Ryerson Rams.

Did you know that the MAC was formerly Maple Leaf Gardens? Our ice rink is under the original roof!

5. Architecture / Eric Palin Hall / Sally Horsfall Eaton Centre

The **Architecture** building boasts a material shop, wind tunnel, 3D printers and other advanced equipment.

Eric Palin Hall is home to our Social Work program, where students receive 840 hours of work placement.

Sally Horsfall Eaton Centre is home to our Child and Youth Care, Midwifery and Disabilities Studies programs.

6. Pitman Hall / Housing / Residence Life Office

Pitman Hall is the largest residence on campus, boasting 565 rooms and offering many different layouts.

The other residences on campus are the **International Living / Learning Centre** and **O'Keefe House**.

7. Rogers Communication Centre / George Vari Engineering and Computing Centre

The **Rogers Communication Centre** is equipped with advanced television, audio and radio production studios.

The **George Vari Engineering and Computing Centre** offers advanced testing facilities and computer labs.

8. Student Campus Centre / Oakham House

The **Student Campus Centre** is home to our Ryerson Students' Union, which advocates for students on campus.

Oakham House is both a venue for campus events and a restaurant that serves affordable student meals.

9. School of Image Arts / Ryerson Image Centre

The **School of Image Arts** is home to our hands-on Photography Studies and Film Studies programs.

The **Ryerson Image Centre** is a museum on campus focused on photography, film and new media.

10. Student Learning Centre / Library

The brand new **Student Learning Centre** has eight floors full of ample study space, each with a unique theme.

Our **Library** is stocked with half a million books and Ryerson's main printing and computer labs.

11. Ted Rogers School of Management

The **Ted Rogers School of Management** is within arms reach of industry professionals on Bay Street.
