- Table I requirements Students cannot use EUS 102 and EUS 202 courses for credit in this table.
  - Table A requirements [lower level liberal studies courses] in 2<sup>nd</sup> year. Students cannot use GEO 110, PHL 214, POL 203 or any EUS courses for credit toward this table. Students may take only 1 Geography course for credit toward this table.
  - Table B requirements [upper level liberal studies courses] in 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> year. Students cannot take HST 788 for credit if they had taken this for their Professional Table II. Students may take only 3 Politics courses or 3 Geography courses for credit. EUS courses are not available for credit
- First year EUS students should not be selecting courses from Table A & B.
