- · Instructors will provide course outlines (including required texts) to students via D2L on the first day of classes.

- · Always check your TMU email account regularly for important information & updates from your program and the university.
- Students are encouraged to use Visual Schedule Builder (VSB) to help create their optimal class schedule.
- Some courses have a wait list function. To add yourself to a wait list, please refer to the Course Wait List website.
- Open electives available in a given semester can be found under "my classes offered" on MyServiceHub. The courses are divided by teaching faculty and then alphabetically by course codes. There are over 500 courses available as Open Electives, so students should focus their search on specific areas of interest.
