#### **Program Course Restrictions**

- Students begin taking courses in their language stream (French or Spanish) in the Winter semester. Students cannot take courses in their stream (FRE or SPN) for Required Group I, Table I (only Core Elective, Table II in Winter).
- · LIR students cannot use LIR 100 to meet their Required Group I, Table I requirements.

### **Important Information**

- All course enrollment is done in MyServiceHub. Log in to <u>my.torontomu.ca</u> to access MyServiceHub, D2L Brightspace, and your TMU Gmail.
- LIR students should select and enroll in the highlighted elective courses shown above (3 in Fall, 4 in Winter). See the LIR FAQ document you were emailed for common questions. See next page for Required Group 1, Table I options.
- Table I, Table II, and Open Elective (OE) courses can be found under "My Classes Offered" in MyServiceHub. As there are over
  500 OE courses (divided by teaching faculty and alphabetically), students should focus their search on specific areas of interest.
- Please refer to the <u>Enrollment Tutorials</u> or the <u>MyServiceHub Support website</u> for instructions on how to add courses.
- Students should run an <u>Academic Advisement Report on MyServiceHub</u> to determine which courses they need to enroll in each semester, and to ensure that the courses apply to their program graduation requirements.
- Students are encouraged to use My Classes Offered and Visual Schedule Builder (VSB) to help create their optimal schedule.
- · Classes are scheduled weekly as a three-hour lecture OR two-hour lecture and one-hour tutorial.
- Some courses have a wait list function. To add yourself to a wait list, please refer to the Course Wait List website.
- A typical course load is 5 courses per semester. Students should speak to their Program Administrator if they wish to reduce course load.
- After you enroll in courses, check MyServiceHub for your timetable.
- · Instructors will provide course outlines (including required texts) to students via D2L on the first day of classes.

### **Transfer Students**

If you have received confirmation about receiving transfer credits for first year courses, you can select courses from Year 2 (or higher) requirements or electives. If you have not yet received confirmation about transfer credits, please enroll in courses as if you have been granted them, but be prepared to drop the courses if confirmation is received. It is recommended that you consult with the Program Administrator for further clarification.
