

Solly Patel Memorial Entrance Award – PAG

The Solly Patel Memorial Entrance Award was created in 2009 to honour the memory of Solly Patel, who was a faculty member in the Department of Politics and School of Public Administration (as it then was), and served a term as the Department Chair in the 1980s. Solly Patel retired in 1996, after 29 years of dedicated and distinguished service to Ryerson, and returned to South Africa, where he died on 30 March 2006 at age 71 years. The endowed award was made possible through a generous donation by his sister, Khatija Patel.

Award Value: \$1000.00

Number: 1 is available to a first year student in Public Administration and Governance program.

Eligibility/Criteria:

- Must be a Canadian Citizen; a Permanent Resident or a Protected Person;
- Must be an Ontario resident;
- Must demonstrate financial need as determined by Ryerson University through completion of a detailed budget submission in accordance with OTSS guidelines; form follows;
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 2 courses/billing units in each of their first two semesters of study;
- Must have a solid academic performance with a minimum 80% overall average in final year of high school.

Decision: The winner will be notified via his/her Ryerson email.
