



The Study Buddy Program pairs Ontario Teacher Candidates with families to support K-12 students in online, one-on-one, free tutoring sessions. Since the initial roll-out in May of 2020, the program has facilitated over 5000 hours of tutoring support for more than 400 students by nearly 200 tutors from 5 universities.



The COVID-19 pandemic has had significant impacts on the Canadian economy, on workplaces, on entrepreneurs and the education system. While companies are laying off workers and small businesses are shutting their doors we are seeing many organizations transform, with new business models, products and services. This disruption has created massive needs for reskilling, upskilling and talent to help support digital transformation and innovation.

At the same time, the impacts are highly differentiated for women, immigrants and racialized people, newcomers, persons with disabilities, youth and others. In addition to the challenges of unemployment and the rapid transition to work from home, families are challenged by the convergence of multiple stresses, particularly with the disruption of schools and childcare facilities. Students of all ages have had to adjust to online learning which has led to uneven approaches in supporting remote students and a massive increase in the burden on families. Teacher candidates from Ontario Faculties of Education have also found their opportunities for in-class placements diminish.
