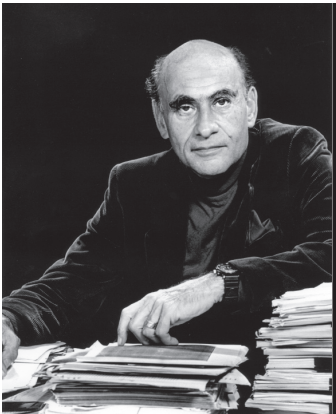

As a journalist, Peter C. Newman was editor in chief of both the country's largest newspaper, the Toronto Star, as well as its most influential periodical, Maclean's - converting it into Canada's first newsmagazine. An award winning author, he has captured the lives of some of Canada's most powerful people as well as writing a popular 4-volume history of the Hudson's Bay Company. In 1998, he received the Lifetime Achievement award from the Canadian Journalism Foundation and has been named a Companion in the Order of Canada.

Known for chronicling the lives of some of Canada's most prominent political and business personalities, Peter C. Newman has never shied away from controversy. He has been called "Canada's most cursed and discussed journalist." In this lecture, Mr. Newman will take a look at Canada's political past and immediate future - drawing on insights and relationships with many of the leading political figures he has written about.

Peter C. Newman has written 24 books which have sold more than two million copies worldwide. They include *Renegade in Power: the Diefenbaker Years* (Canada's all-time political bestseller), *The Establishment Man* (an intimate profile of Conrad Black that he hated), *The Canadian Revolution: From Deference to Defiance*, and *The Secret Mulroney Tapes: Unguarded Confessions of a Prime Minister*, which became the source of unprecedented controversy.
