Lack of Child Rights Education & Understanding

"A fundamental barrier to participation is that **youth** may not know they have a right to participate".



"In Canada, the key challenge is to implement some form of entitlement to [child rights education] and to ensure teachers are adequately trained"

Rising Mental Health Challenges due to COVID-19

Reported feeling a combination of worried, upset, sad and angry about the abrupt end to the school year, ability to see their friends, and uncertainty about the future

On returning back to school, children reported moderate levels of anxiety

Historical & Current Gaps in Child Rights Implementation




"The **social and economic issues that** contribute to the overrepresentation of Black children in child welfare include poverty, the lack of adequate and appropriate services and supports, and the intergenerational effects of systemic racism." (Canadian Human Rights Commission, 2020, pp. 13)

"...negative assumptions about poverty and race, policies and system-level practices, and an individual's conscious or unconscious racial bias... may lead to incorrect assumptions about the level of risk racialized children are exposed to, which could result in decisions that adversely affect Black children and their families." (Canadian Human Rights Commission, 2020, pp. 13)

Barriers to Child Participation

"While youth participation is occurring in some spaces, there seems to be an overall lack of commitment to ensure all young people are heard...when young people are provided with opportunities to participate, they tend to be disproportionately represented or underrepresented..."
