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A Day in the Life of a Cyber Security Analyst

We had a conversation with Navya Sirohi, a Business Technology Management Co-op student at the Ted Rogers School of Management.

Navya worked as a *Cyber Security Analyst*, on the Cyber Threat Intelligence team at the **Bank of Canada** for her Winter 2023 Work Term.

The <u>Bank of Canada</u> was founded as Canada's central bank in 1934 and opened its doors in March 1935. In 1938, it became a Crown Corporation belonging to the Federal Government. As Canada's Central Bank, their principal role is to promote the country's economic and financial welfare by keeping inflation low, stable, and predictable.

In this report, Navya shared the type of work she did, the software platforms she used, and what it is like being a Ted Rogers Co-op student.





• What did you do on a "day-to-day" basis in your role as a Cyber Security Analyst?

A:

As part of my daily duties at the Bank, I closely monitored cyber news and assessed potential threats to the institution. This involved compiling technical reports and threat assessments on previous attacks by threat actors, as well as those that may have posed a future risk to the Bank.

After completing these reports, I shared them with the detection engineering team for an in-depth analysis. To stay up-to-date on the latest security news, we relied on a platform called <u>Feedly</u>, which sent alerts and updates straight to our team.

I carefully reviewed this information each day and communicated any concerning findings to the Central Threat and Intelligence (CTI) team, helping to ensure the Bank was prepared to address any potential threats.
