Choosing Hospitality and Tourism Management

Did you know that the HTM program was the first program of its kind in Canada and just celebrated its 70th anniversary! We have more than 4,600 graduates in the marketplace and a very involved and active alumni association. Just think, in four years time, you will be joining this esteemed group!

Until then, the HTM program offers you a mix of applied professional, professional-related, and liberal studies courses. Core topics in Marketing, Organizational



Behaviour and Accounting provide you with the business fundamentals.

You will go on to study topics specific to this field, including Financial and Revenue Management, Advance Service Management Systems, and Research and Data Analysis. Along with all required courses, students in the HTM program are expected to complete 1,000 hours of work experience in the industry.¹

Apply to Co-op at the End of Your 1st Year

You will apply to the Ted Rogers Co-op program at the end of your 1st year - a CGPA of 2.8 is expected, in addition to the completion of your core courses.




Skills Employers Are Seeking
